Competency Assessment Instrument

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This competency assessment instrument is designed to assist you and your faculty advisor in documenting your incoming knowledge and assessing your progress the academic program. The 17 competencies integrate ALA/AASL Competency Standards, as well as information from the New York State Preparation Guide to the Content Specialty Exam for Library Media Specialists, in order to adequately prepare you for New York State Certification requirements.

#### Use the following steps to rate your competence in each competency area:

- 1) <u>Level:</u> In this space and using the codes below, indicate an estimation of your ability to perform each competency, based on your successful completion of the related course assignment (and an additional experience, if applicable).
  - **4 = Proficiency level** I feel very confident in my ability to perform this competency.
  - **3 = Moderate level** I am somewhat confident in my ability to perform this competency.
  - **2 = Familiarity level** I have some elementary knowledge in this area, and may have performed it once or twice.
  - **1 = Entrance level** I have little to no knowledge or experience in this area.
- 2) <u>Acquisition Method:</u> Each competency is linked to a course in your academic program that provided you with an opportunity to acquire that competency. However, you may also have gained expertise in that competency area from other experiences, such as fieldwork, professional work experience, or some other relevant activity. At a minimum, you should check the course assignment for that competency once you have successfully completed it (<u>grade B or better</u>). Space is provided for you to specify, if applicable, one additional experience, using one of the codes below.
  - **FP** = Fieldwork Project **PA** = Practicum Activity **WE** = Work Experience **OTH** = Other (please specify)
- 3) <u>Demonstration:</u> Use this space to specify exactly how you achieved this competency by describing the relevant assignment or activity. A description of the course assignment is already provided for you. If you have another activity related to this competency, you need to briefly describe it. You are required to include a copy of each graded, competency-related assignment in your portfolio.
- 4) <u>Total:</u> Total your scores for each section in the box marked "Total." Your total scores and advisor's comments are valuable to you for identifying gaps in your competencies and to select appropriate projects during your coursework, fieldwork and practicum experiences.

This record should be updated electronically *four* times (following the table below. Each version should be submitted to your School Media Forum WebCT dropbox.

- 1. <u>Baseline:</u> You must submit the completed baseline competency assessment instrument *at the very beginning of your program* (*during your first semester*), *before you take any courses*. The instrument is valuable as a tool for selection of fieldwork projects, class projects, and other course-related activities.
- 2. <u>Prior to 2<sup>nd</sup> Fieldwork:</u> This version of the competency assessment instrument must be submitted *before beginning your second 50-hour fieldwork experience*. This formative version is valuable to you, your advisor, the fieldwork coordinator, and your site supervisor as a way of identifying gaps in your knowledge/skills that need filling or for project selection during your final fieldwork experience.
- 3. <u>Prior to 2<sup>nd</sup> Practicum:</u> This version of the competency assessment instrument must be submitted *with your second practicum Learning Agreement.* This formative version is valuable to you and your practicum site supervisor as a way of identifying gaps in your knowledge, skills, or experiences that need filling, or for project selection during your final practicum experience.
- **4.** <u>Final:</u> A fourth and final competency assessment instrument should be submitted *after your final practicum and all coursework has been completed*. The final instrument is a critical part of your portfolio, the exit requirement for the School Media Program. This summative version is valuable to you, your advisor, and the SM Director for assessing your intellectual and professional growth during your academic program. A copy of each graded, competency-related assignment must be included in your portfolio.
